

COLLECTIVE QUESTIONS FROM TOWN & PARISH COUNCILS: CCTV IN CORNWALL

Q: What are the annual breakdown of costs for the County Hall – Bunker option:-

- 1) For the hire of the room, heat and power, etc
- 2) For the CCTV monitoring on a per camera/per hour basis
- 3) Are these costs fixed for each Town & Parish Council or will the cost depend on the number of camera's monitored in each town?
- 4) Is this price fixed for the duration of the contract or will there be an annual increase?

Q: Are these costs contingent on a minimum number of T & PCs entering into an agreement?

Yes, as has been discussed through this process, costs are being obtained based on interested parties. This could increase or decrease depending on numbers.

Q: What is the length of contract in years, that the County Hall option is guaranteed to run for and are there any break clauses on either side?

This lease will now be entered into with highways. These details can be discussed in more detail at the next meeting for the lease to be reflective of the needs of the group.

Q: Supplementary to this, how could a change in administration at Cornwall Council affect this?

Highways undertaking the lease mitigates any risk to administration changes.

Q: Has Cornwall Council entered into strategic discussions at a senior level with the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner (OPCC) or the Devon & Cornwall Police about them becoming a strategic investor in CCTV provision across Cornwall?

No, Cornwall Council has not entered into any discussions with the OPCC, this would need to be done by towns individually or by you as a collective management group away from the council.

Q: How long will the Fire Service continue to offer the current service beyond June 2024, as any new procurement process would need naturally take longer – circa December 2024.

CFRS are committed to supporting CCTV monitoring through the development of the NCH option.

Q: How will the CCTV monitoring provider be procured?

Through Enerveo (SSE) procurement guidelines

Q: If we do not decide to proceed with the Bunker option can the equipment at Tolvaddon be devolved to Town Councils to save them buying their own equipment?

If there is no longer a requirement for the space at NCH and towns look to seek alternative provision then the equipment will be devolved as previously discussed.
