Provision of a community access defibrillator on the exterior of the Church Centre in Church Street South with 24 hour continuous access. It will have continuous remote monitoring for communication with the emergency ambulance service, an essential part of the whole population defibrillator network as it alerts them immediately for an appropriate response. St Martin's Church had previously provided a defibrillator
for public use in this location but the hire agreement has come to an end and needs replacing.
In addition to the defibrillator the cabinet will also contain a 'stab kit', a small package containing equipment for control of major bleeding and other injuries associated with knife crime. This is increasingly recognised as a problem in all communities in the UK, and such kits one means of mitigating its effects, but such injuries occur in many other situations.
This life saving aid will be located near the town main church (second largest in Cornwall), a community centre, a gymnasium, and the main town periphery supermarkets with access to the A38 high speed trunk road. The housing estates have a high proportion of the elderly and infirm, but self supporting. Housing development is predominantly on the east of the town.
There are other public access defibrillators in Liskeard but the one at the Church Centre is the only one on the east side with 24 hour access. There are no others serving the southeast quarter. The nearest in the town centre is at the Constitutional Club. This is only a couple of hundred metres away but at the bottom of a very steep hill which taxes even a fit young person on foot. Access by vehicle is relatively difficult due to the street layout of a one way system and traffic lights. Speed of collection of a defibrillator and return to the scene is of critical importance for survival of a cardiac arrest.
